ELIGIBILITY

Athletes competing for a USA Shooting Team position must be a U.S.A. Citizen competing for the United States of America. Junior Competitors are described by ISSF Rule 3.7.4.12. All competitors must be a current member of USA Shooting. Click here to become a member: https://members.usashooting.org/

ENTRIES

The individual event fee will be \$300.00 per event. Register at this link. https://ems.usashooting.org/shotgun-olympic-selection-part-2

Entries are limited to range capacity on a first come-first-serve basis. If all slots become full, registration will close when capacity is reached. Onsite registrations will be available on a *space-available basis ONLY*.

CANCELLATION POLICY

Cancellations prior to March 4th will have their match fees refunded, minus a small administrative fee. Cancellations after March 5th will not be refunded, except for emergencies or illness.

RULES

ISSF Shooting Rules and Match Director Bulletins will govern this championship. All competitors are responsible for compliance with these rules.

Junior Competitors are described by ISSF Rule 3.7.4.12:

Juniors-Athletes will remain as Juniors until the 31st December of the year in which they become 21 years of age. Any athlete born between the 1st January and the 31st December, will cease to be a Junior on the 31st December of that year.

International competitors are **only** eligible to win Visitor/International Awards. If participation warrants an international final, it will be held after 125 targets.

SAFESPORT

SafeSport training is recommended but not required for all adult Athletes for this match but *is required for Coaches* (other than parents coaching their own child(ren). SafeSport training can be found through your membership profile at https://members.usashooting.org/member/login, in the "Membership Information" section. SafeSport Training can be started through the "SafeSport Training" tab on the *left-hand* column.

COACH REGISTRATION

In order to actively coach an Athlete during the match (other than parents who are coaching their own child), Coaches must complete Safe Sport and register as a Coach for this match. To complete this requirement, you must be a USA Shooting member and complete the training through your USA Shooting membership profile. If you are not already a USA Shooting member, you can sign up under the "Coach" (non-competitive) membership at reduced cost. Note: OPTC background screening is not required for this event.

Tucson Trap & Skeet requires For Hire Coaches to carry private insurance.

CHECK-IN

All competitors will need to check in with the event staff by noon on the PET Day. If you cannot make it by this time, make sure to send a representative to check in for you.

TEAM SELECTION

This is a selection match for the Shotgun Open National Team Men & Women. This is the 2nd selection match for the Shotgun Junior National Team Men & Women. The selection procedures posted on the USA Shooting website can be found here: Team Selection Procedures

SQUADDING

It is the competitor's responsibility to check squadding and know when and where they are scheduled to compete. All shooters will have assistant referee (flanking) duties. Squadding will be emailed, posted at the range, and posted online. For the first course (125) of fire the top 18 Open Men & Women will be squadded together based on 2023 Hillsdale Nationals Aggregate score in random order. In the second course of fire the top 18 Open Men & Women will be squadded together based on results of the 1st course of fire at the current match.

ATHLETES' CLOTHING

Refer to ISSF Shotgun Rules 9.13.1. USA Shooting has exceptions to this rule, and permitted items of clothing include blue jeans, and camouflage. No clothing should have holes or offensive writing.

AMMUNITION

USA Shooting and ISSF require **24g** cartridges, no exceptions (see ISSF Shotgun Rules 9.4.3). Failure to comply will result in disqualification from the match. **24g** Ammunition will be available for sale during the match.

COMPETITOR MEETING

A mandatory meeting will be held on the PET Day for both Trap and Skeet in front of the clubhouse. Rules of the range, athlete flanking responsibilities, and overall match information will be provided at this meeting.

PROTESTS

A fee of \$50.00 must accompany any protest. Forms are available on ISSF Website.

OFFICIATING

Juries will be appointed and convened as required to resolve any protest. Decisions of the jury will be final. The classification jury will resolve any scoring challenges.
